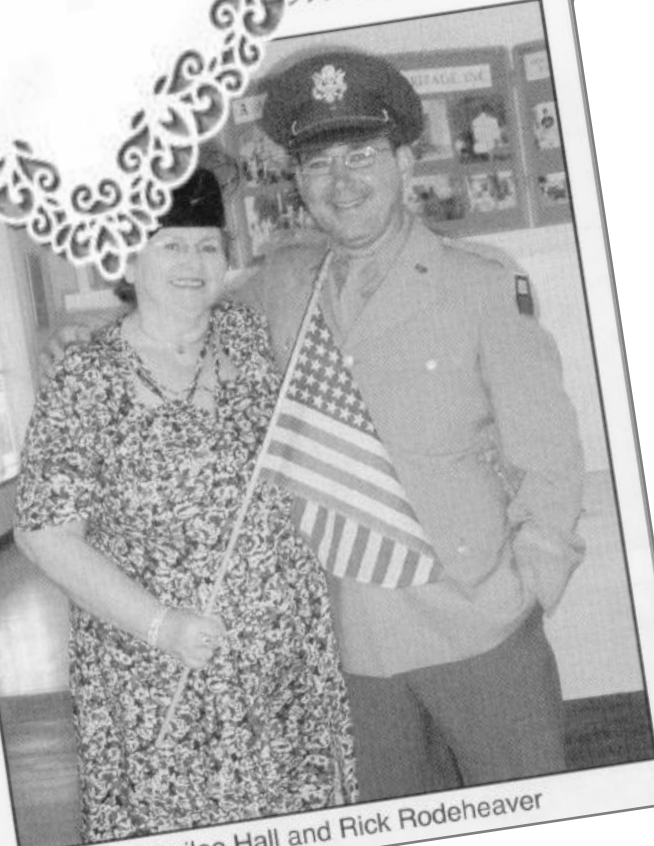
Marilee Hall Named Volunteer of the Year

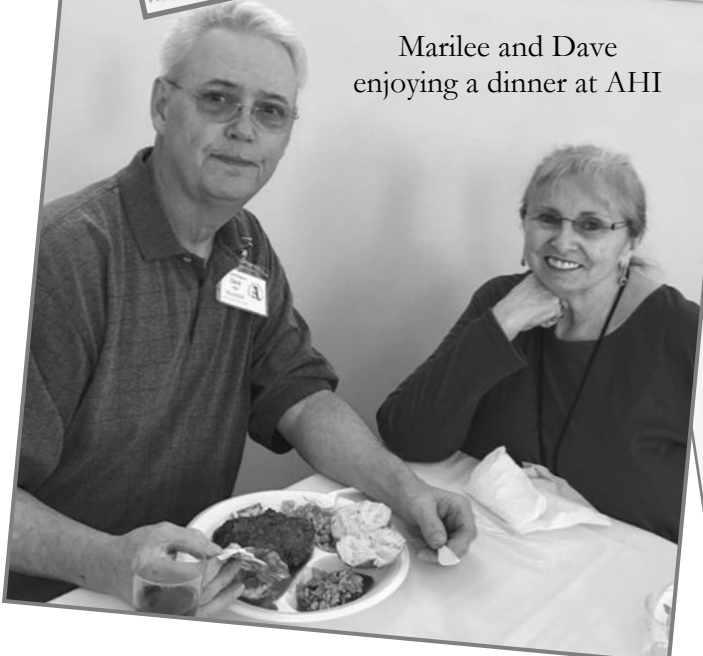

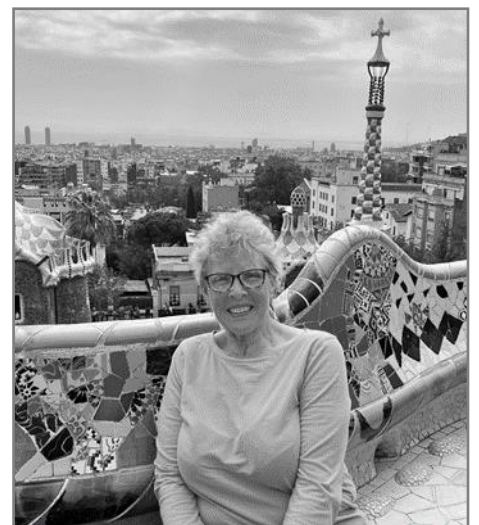


Arthurdale Heritage has won multiple accolades from the state and from other WV agencies under her inspiring leadership.

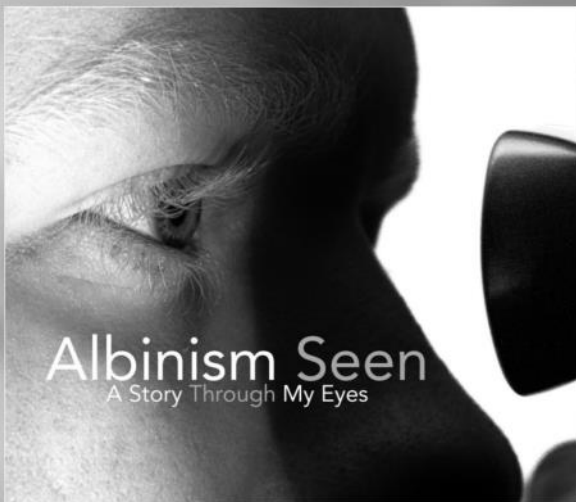
